Money and the Church 2 Kings 12:1-16, Pew Bible p. 318 January 7, 2024

I. Command to Remodel the Temple (V. 1-8)

- A. The physical care of God's house is the spiritual <u>responsibility</u> of God's people.
- B. God's people give both from the heart and as a <u>discipline</u>.
- C. God's people must be <u>led</u> in their giving.
 - 1. There's a difference between leading and <u>manipulating</u>.
 - 2. Not everyone who wants to give knows <u>how</u> to give.

II. The Process of Remodeling the Temple (V. 9-16)

- A. Fundamental truths about Christian giving
 - 1. God does not <u>need</u> our money.
 - 2. Our money is a great way to <u>express</u> our devotion to Christ.
 - 3. Our money cannot <u>replace</u> our devotion to Christ.
 - 4. Our money requires a combination of trust and accountability.
 - 5. Everything our money builds is temporary, but the faith our money expresses is <u>eternal</u>.
- B. The house of God will always have a combination of committed givers and paid workers.
 - 1. Committed givers are needed because God <u>commands</u> it.
 - 2. Paid workers are needed because not everyone is <u>qualified</u> for every kind of work.

Group Discussion Questions

- 1. Read 2 Kings 12:1-16.
- 2. Have you ever been a part of a church which had a building/property in disrepair? What contributed to this situation? What did it say about the church?
- 3. How can giving money to God's church express devotion to God, as verses 5-6 imply about King Jehoash? How is giving money as a Christian both an issue of the heart and a matter of discipline, as verses 4-5 imply?
- 4. Why did Judah need King Jehoash's leadership in the matter of remodeling the temple, according to verses 7-8? In what ways do Christians today need to be led in giving to God's church?
- 5. What is the difference between being led in giving to God, which is what the king and the high priest were doing (V. 7-10), and being manipulated to give to God, which is an all too common problem in religious circles today?
- 6. What do verses 9-16 imply about the need for both committed givers and paid workers in the church? What happens if one of either is missing in the church today?
- 7. Pray for our church members to give sacrificially and joyfully to the gospel ministry of the church. Come to the church prayer meeting this Wednesday from 6:00–6:30 pm in Worship Center Room 103. Look for the prayer meeting sign, then enter through the outside door directly across from the Fellowship Center doors.
