I. The Terminal Disease of Sin (V. 23-24)

- A. Unbroken sin leads to <u>apathy</u> toward God and His word.
- B. Unbroken sin leads to <u>preoccupation</u> with yourself.

II. The Unfathomable Grace of God (V. 25-29)

- A. God's <u>fidelity</u> to His own word
- B. God <u>alone</u> can save.

6. Before God saved you, who (or what) else did you put your trust in for fulfillment in life? How does that measure up to the life you have in Christ?
