I. The Ark Brought to Jerusalem (V. 1-11)

A. True strength isn't about our ability to build our house and exalt our name, but about our heart to build God's house and exalt God's name.

B. Worship is:

1. Organized
2. Led
3. Corporate
4. Prescribed

II. Solomon Blesses the Lord (V. 12-21)

A. True strength comes from remembering the great works of God.

B. About the House of God:

1. It is a place of remembrance.
2. God does not need it.
3. We do well to honor it.

Group Discussion Questions

1. Read 1 Kings 8:1-21.
2. How do organization and leadership help worship, as verses 1-3 imply?
3. Why does it matter to both worship God and do it in the way He prescribes, as verses 4-8 imply? Read Leviticus 25:10-15 for more information on how the ark and its poles were supposed to be used, and consider also reading 2 Samuel 6:1-7 to see what happened when this command is not kept.
4. How can God be both merciful to sinners and so rigid in His prescription of worship? Are these two characteristics mutually exclusive?
5. What is the relationship between the presence of God and the house of God, according to verses 10-11? What do you think happens to a church if that relationship is lost?
6. How does worshiping in church help us remember the works of God, as it did Solomon in verse 15? How can you better remember the works of God in your life?
7. Pray for our church members to be on mission to all people. Consider coming to the church prayer meeting this Wednesday from 6:00-6:30 pm in the Worship Center across the hall from the Choir Room.
