1 Corinthians 12:1-11, Pew Bible p. 959

I. The Presence of the Holy Spirit (V. 1-3)

- A. Christian unity means we are Spirit-led (V. 2).
- B. Christian unity means we have one confession (V. 3).

II. The Gifts of the Holy Spirit (V. 4-11)

- A. Christian unity does not mean serving ourselves (V. 7).
- B. Christian unity does not mean uniformity (V. 4-6, 8-10).
- C. Christian unity does not mean self-empowerment (V. 11).

Group Discussion Questions

1. Read 1 Corinthians 12:1-11.
2. What is the difference between being led by idols and being led by the Holy Spirit, according to verse 2? Ask willing group members to share about times in their lives when they were led by idols as opposed to their time being led by God.
3. Does the presence of the Holy Spirit mean Christians can say anything they want as long as they say God told them to, according to verse 3? Why?
4. Even though there is one Spirit living in all Christians, does that mean they all do the same thing, according to verses 4-6?
5. What are spiritual gifts meant to do, according to verse 7? Why is that important?
6. What is your spiritual gift? If you need help, ask your group for affirmation on the Spirit's work in you. How have you used your spiritual gifts for the common good? If you're not sure you have ever done so, how do you think you can use them in the future?
