3. Talk about other implications behind Jesus being the Creator of all things. What else does that say about who Jesus is?
4. Why is it important that John say Jesus has life? What do you think that had to do with His purpose on earth as a man?
5. How does John 1:1-5 help you interpret the creation story of Genesis 1:1-4?
6. What do you think about this resume of Christ before His birth? What does that say about His qualifications as a Savior? What are some other saviors people have made up since creation? Why do you think people tend to invent saviors of their own making?
7. Pray for our church, that our members would be on mission among lost family and friends this holiday season. Consider coming to our online church prayer meeting every Sunday at 7 pm.
