# Joy in Suffering Job 19:1-29, Pew Bible p. 429 December 18, 2022

### I. The Pain of Suffering (V. 1-22)

- A. The world will always prefer to blame suffering on the <u>sufferer</u>.
- B. Why would a good God allow suffering?
  - 1. To <u>rebuke</u> Satan.
  - 2. To <u>perfect</u> our faith.
  - 3. To point to Jesus.

## II. The Hope of the Redeemer (V. 23-29)

- A. The Redeemer makes suffering worth it.
- B. The Redeemer makes sin not worth it.
- C. The Redeemer proves there is no such thing as a <u>victim</u> of God.

#### **Group Discussion Questions**

- 1. Read Job 19:1-29.
- 2. Is it possible for people to face intense suffering without it being their fault, as Job claims in verse 4? Why do we tend to use people's disgrace (pain) as an argument against them (an argument to prove it's their fault), as Job's friends did in verses 5?
- 3. Who is ultimately responsible for Job's suffering in verses 8-13? How can God be good and yet allow innocent people to suffer?
- 4. Share a time in your life that you went through intense pain from no fault of your own. Why do you think God allowed you to suffer that pain?
- 5. In all of Job's pain and suffering, what does he say will finally bring him peace, according to verse 26? What does that tell you about the meaning of life?
- 6. Why is the coming judgment at the hands of the Redeemer a good thing, according to verse 29? In what ways is Jesus both a redeemer and a judge?
- 7. Pray for our church members to be on mission to all people during this Christmas season. Consider coming to the church prayer meeting this Wednesday 6:00-6:30 pm in the Worship Center across the hall from the Choir Room.
