- D. Jesus references His ability to overcome darkness in His protection of Ruth.
- E. Jesus references His ability to overcome darkness in His forgiving David and exalting Bathsheba.

II. Saving Those Who Believe from David to Deportation (V. 6-11)

- A. Jesus references His heart to save those who believe in His blessing of good kings.
- B. Jesus references His heart to save those who believe in His punishing of evil kings.

III. Faithfulness to His Promises from the Deportation to Christ (V. 12-17)

- A. Jesus references His faithfulness to keep His promises in His remembering the outcasts.

1. Read Matthew 1:1-17.
2. Why do you think Matthew wanted to start the story of Jesus with a long genealogy? How could it possibly contribute to the story of Jesus' birth or ministry?
3. Are there any names on this list that you never thought of as ancestors of Jesus Christ? Why?
4. What are some names on this list you remember from other books of the Bible? What are some names that are unfamiliar to you?
5. What does this genealogy say about Jesus' family history? Does He come from good or bad stock? Why?
6. Who are the four women in this genealogy? Since including women in a Hebrew family tree is unusual, why do you think Matthew chose to put these women in it?
