## Group Discussion Questions

1. Read 2 Samuel 15:13-37.
2. Why do the consequences of sin continue (in this life) even if God has completely forgiven a person for their sin?
3. How could consequences that are sometimes so difficult to bear be a reminder of God's great love for us?
4. David did not desire to take the Ark of the Covenant with him in his departure from Jerusalem. Instead, David told Zadok to return the Ark of the Covenant to Jerusalem. *"Return the ark of God to the city. If I find favor in the sight of the Lord, then He will bring me back again and show me both it and His habitation. But if He should say thus, 'I have no delight in you,' behold, here I am, let Him do to me as seems good to Him."* (2 Samuel 15:25-26) Why did David do this? Would the Ark of the Covenant have given David extra grace from God?
5. People had screamed at King David when he was departing Jerusalem (2 Samuel 16:7,8) that he was beyond hope, he was simply reaping what he had sowed, God would never deliver him, he was now hopeless! Was this true? Have you ever felt like God has given up on you?
6. Instead of simply running from his enemies, David ran to God. In Psalm 3, what happened to David when he focused on God rather than on his enemies?
7. Pray for each other that we would avoid sin and grow in the walk of righteousness. Also pray for each other that when we are dealing with the consequences of sin, we will realize that God has placed them in our lives to remind us that He loves us and does not want us to continue in unrighteous ways that will ruin our lives.
