Group Discussion Questions

1. Read 1 Corinthians 1:18-31.
2. Have you ever shared with great excitement about Jesus and the cross and noticed the person with whom you were sharing thought you were weird? How did you know they thought that? What is so hard to understand about the gospel to the rest of the world?
3. Is this passage saying Christianity is irrational or illogical? Why? What is the difference between knowing why you believe in Christ and dependence on worldly wisdom?
4. Has there ever been a thinker in the history of the world who has claimed knowledge of the forgiveness of sins? Why?
5. Is it possible for a Christian to convince someone to follow Christ with any argument besides the gospel, as Paul discusses in verse 21? Why? What are some arguments the world would prefer us to use besides the gospel?
6. Are all people susceptible to finding their self-worth in their own works? Why? What about the cross helps protect you from boasting in your own strength?
