## Discussion Questions

1. Read 2 Kings 25:8-21
2. What does God's anger towards Judah's unrepentant sin teach us about God? Would God be angry today if a church acted like Judah did? Why or why not?
3. Judah believed that God's temple would never fall, because it was God's dwelling place. Why would God allow his temple to fall and be pillaged? What are some reasons that God would allow a church to fail today?
4. Most of the leadership in Judah was killed instead of taken into exile because they were frequently trusting in false prophecies that made them feel good instead of the true prophecies that warned about destruction. What are some ways that a church might trade truth for comfort?
5. How does unrepentant sin interfere with the church's ability to share the gospel with others? Give some examples of how you have seen unrepentant sin limit the influence of the gospel?
